

DESIGN FOR A VENDING-MACHINE CASING.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, THEODORE BRIEGEL, a citizen of the United States, residing at Rock Island, in the county of Rock Island and State of Illinois, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for Vending-Machine Casings, of which the following is a specification.

My invention has reference to designs for vending machines, and pertains more specially to machines of that class which are intended for the sale of matches and similar articles.

The figure of the drawings is a front perspective of my invention, which comprises a base 1, having outwardly curved sides and

a flaring bottom part 2, a plate 3 supported thereon, and a rectangular body portion 4, mounted on the plate 3 and surmounted by an ornamental cap 5. At the corners of the body portion 4 are rods 6 extending upwardly through the cap 5 and provided at their upper ends with ornamental caps 7.

What I claim as my invention is:

The ornamental design for a vending machine casing, substantially as shown.
